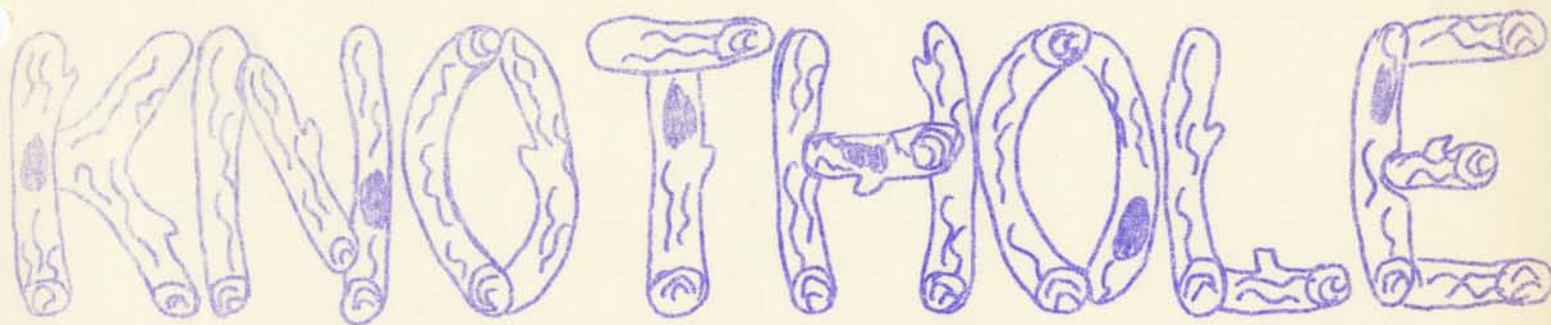

SFA To Host Short Course for Area Government

Next week (March 13-19) the SFA School of Forestry will host a short course entitled Management of Forest Land Adjacent to Reservoirs. Held at the request of the New Orleans District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the course will feature speakers from the School of Forestry, U.S. Forest Service, Soil Conservation Service, Texas Department of Parks and Wildlife, U.S. Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife and the forest industry.
