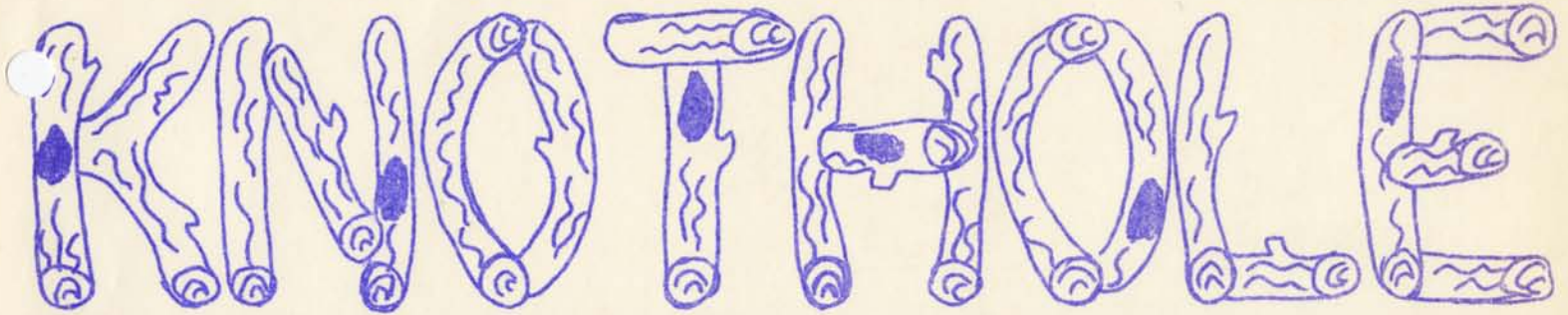

Environmental Conservation Workshop

From Dr. Singer comes this request for help. He is asking that students who are going home for Easter Vacation, would you please keep the page and give it to one of your high school teachers (primary or secondary). It contains some information he would like to get to as many of your high school teachers as possible.

Dr. Singer and Dr. Bilan will be directing the Third Annual Three Week Citizen and Teacher-Training Workshop on Environment Conservation. It will be held in the Forestry building at Stephen F. Austin State University from July 9th through July 27th, with classes from 9-12 noon, Monday through Friday. This 3-credit course may be used as an undergraduate elective in education and it also satisfies the requirements of school boards for periodic refresher courses.

- meet environmental resource specialists

On April 15 SFA will host a State Woodland Clinic. Teams representing several schools from around the state will compete in forest knowledge events. SFA to Host Photogrammetry Meeting

On May 24, 1971, SFASU will host a meeting on SPACE PHOTOGRAPHY AND THE ENVIRONMENT. The meeting is sponsored by the U. S. Geological Survey and other government agencies. It will be for state and regional officials, city officials, engineers, city planners and university officials. Space photography and other remote sensing systems from space will be outlined.

Speakers will be from West Virginia University, the U. S. Geological Survey, the Earth Resources Observation Satellite Program, and NASA. Dr. Baker and Dr. Smith will coordinate plans for the meeting.

Forestry Faculty Aids Temple Industries

Water Reclamation Project

A research contract has been made with Temple Industries to solve problems involved in a current water reclamation project. The project involves the spraying of effluent from their fiber-board mill onto a cleared area in the forest planted to grass. It is hoped that the grass and soil will

serve as a natural filter which will purify the water and allow it to (by subsurface drainage) be re-used by the plant. Drs. Burkart and Watterston are working with Temple Industries on the project.
