Notice to School of Forestry Seniors

If you anticipate graduating in December 1971, the deadline for making application for degree is Oct. 12.

You must make sure that the following steps are taken in order for the degree to be granted:

1. Completion of final graduation plan. This procedure begins in Marvina Bishop's office.
2. Payment of fee. This \$10 fee is paid in the University Bookstore; it is not refundable. If you do not graduate, you must re-apply the next semester and pay again.
3. Application for Degree. Bring receipt from Bookstore to Nancy King's office, where you will fill out an "Application for Degree" form. This application is official, and it is the most important step. If this green card is not completed, your name does not appear on the list of graduating seniors and no diploma is ordered for you.
4. A few weeks before graduation, you will receive from the office of the Vice-President for Academic Affairs a letter and instructions for graduation procedure. If there are any deficiencies on your records (low grade points, withheld grades, or failed courses, etc.), you will receive notification from the Dean of the School of Forestry. If you receive no such notification, you should assume that everything is in order for your graduation.

If for some reason you are unable to attend graduation, please notify the office of the Dean of the School of Forestry.
